

# **The Convention Medal**



he RCNA 2013 Winnipeg Convention medal employs an outstanding dynamic design. Susan M Poseluzney, a member of the Manitoba Coin Club, is the concept design originator. The design, inspired by the logo for the Manitoba Coin Club Inc, employs a three-quarter image of an American bison, also known as the American buffalo. The American bison is also an official symbol of Manitoba, and can be found on the shield of the Coat of arms of Manitoba.

The translation of the design into medallic form is the work of Daniel Carr. Carr produced the design using the "VS3D Virtual Sculptor" software, which he developed. The program allows for the virtual

sculpting of a digital design, and the subsequent transfer of the imagery "into physical form using a Computer Numeric Control (CNC) milling/engraving machine." Once the dies are hand-finished and hardened, they are employed to strike the medals on his Graebener coin press.

Carr is a mechanical engineer and "computer-aided-design (CAD) and image-processing software development programmer." In 1998 he combined his skills and interest in coins to design coins, tokens, and medals. In 2007 he purchased a Graebener coin press previously used at the US Mint in Denver. Shortly thereafter, his business expanded to a full-service, one-stop operation, from development of design concept through to engraving of steel dies, and striking of the final product.

Highlights of his work to date include the 2001 New York and Rhode Island designs for the US 50 State Quarter series. Daniel Carr has also developed the designs, dies, and struck the past five RCNA Convention medals. He is the owner of Designs Computed, LLC and the Moonlight Mint. 



**Henry Nienhuis, FRCNA, FCNRS, FONA.** A collector of Canadian decimal, Canadian error, and Dutch provincial coinage. Henry is the author of many numismatic articles and a regular contributor to *The CN Journal*. He is currently chairman of the RCNA Education Committee, associate editor of *The CN Journal*, layout editor of *The Ontario Numismatist*, founding president of the Canadian Error and Varieties Numismatic Association, and a Fellow of the Canadian Numismatic Research Society, the Royal Canadian Numismatic Association and the Ontario Numismatic Association.

# Speaker Introduction:

**James Astwood, FCNRS.** James W. (Jim) Astwood was born in Winnipeg and lived most of his life there. A chartered accountant by profession, he has been collecting coins, tokens, paper money, medals, and anything numismatic for over 60 years and currently is focused on Manitoba tokens and banknotes. He has been the guest speaker at previous CNA conventions and at Manitoba Coin Club meetings. Jim has written many articles on tokens for various Canadian publications and has also written for *Paper Money*, the journal of the Society of Paper Money

Collectors. He is a member of the RCNA, CPMS, CATC, SPMC, a life member of the Manitoba Coin Club and a Fellow of the Canadian Numismatic Research Society.

**LLoyd Chan.** Collecting since age of 10, Lloyd collects mainly US type coins and some world coins (whatever is interesting). He has been involved in organized collecting since 2008; a member of the ANA, Vallejo Numismatic Society, Fairfield Coin Club, Diablo Numismatic Society, CSNA, NCNA, RCNA, ONA and CAWMC. His current interests are ancient coinage (Greek & Roman Imperial-2nd century), US type, and Canadian silver dollars including the 1967 *diving goose* varieties.

**George Cuhaj.** George Cuhaj is editor at Krause Publications with primary responsibility for the *Standard Catalogue of World Coins* and the *Standard Catalogue of World Paper Money* series, as well as the online data base, *NumisMaster*. He has also authored a book on US scouting collectibles. He is a past president of the American Medallic Sculpture Association, and has had his medal creations exhibited internationally. Along with his mom they sponsor a young artist prize at the bi-annual FIDEM art medal congresses. Prior to joining the KP staff in Iola, Wisconsin, George worked at the American Numismatic Society and Stack's Rare Coins, both in his hometown of New York City.

**Ian Laing.** Mr. Laing is most well known as the president of Gatewest Stamp & Coin Ltd. a major numismatic dealer and distributor of Royal Canadian Mint products since 1972. In addition to being a very successful dealer, Mr. Laing is an avid collector of bank legals and of the treaty medals of British North America

**Michael S. Turrini, FRCNA.** An active collector and numismatist for over 40 years. He is well known throughout the United States as a promoter of youth involvement in numismatics and is an active member of over 75 coin clubs. He is the Western United States Regional Director for the RCNA, past director and regional coordinator of the ANA and life member of the ONA Michael is the recipient of the Fellow of the RCNA, the ANA Presidential Award (twice), the ANA Medal of Merit among many other honours. Mr. Turinni is the current President of the California State Numismatic Association.

# **RCNA Numismatic Awards**

A number of prestigious numismatic awards will be presented at various functions throughout the convention.

# **Paul Fiocca Award**

The Paul Fiocca Award was established in 2008 and is presented annually for "long term meritorious service or major contributions to the R.C.N.A." and is an award not just to recognize the elite of the hobby, but any individual who may have worked behind the scenes, often for many decades for the betterment of the Association. This award is an R.C.N.A. award for R.C.N.A. members and is not to be confused with the J. Douglas Ferguson Award the highest award in Canadian numismatics, which does not require membership in the R.C.N.A.

# **Fellow of the RCNA**

In 1990, the C.N.A. Executive Committee established a member service award: "Fellow – Canadian Numismatic Association." To be recognized for this award, a member of the R.C.N.A. must have performed a worthy service judged to be a direct benefit to the Association. The Awards and Medal Committee chooses the recipients from nominations made by R.C.N.A. members. The committee then presents up to five choices from the nominations each year at the annual convention. An award of "Fellow of The Royal Canadian Numismatic Association" authorizes use of the letters, F.R.C.N.A. to follow the recipient's name. The first awards were presented at the 1991 C.N.A. Convention in Toronto, Ontario.

# **President's Award**

It is the R.C.N.A. President's prerogative to recognize supporters, whether they are individuals or groups for outstanding support of the Association. The President's Award consist of a trophy and a medal. This award is presented in front of a large audience, either at the annual general meeting or at the banquet, befitting the special occasion of the event.

# **Guy Potter Literary Award**

The Guy Potter Literary Award was established when the original C.N.A. Literary Award was renamed in 1978 to honour the memory of Guy R. I. Potter, who was one of the founders of the Canadian Numismatic Association. Mr. Potter served as Secretary and Bulletin Editor of the Association from its beginning in 1950 until 1953 and as the third president of the C.N.A. from 1955-1956.

# Jérôme H. Remick III Literary Award

The Jerome H. Remick III Literary Award was established in 1995 and its sponsorship continues through a bequest by Mr. Remick who was an active member of the C.N.A. and a well-known author. This award is presented annually to the author of the best numismatic article published in a local Canadian coin club newsletter during the previous calendar year. This award is administered by the R.C.N.A. The award is a large bronze medal that is presented to the winning author during the following year's R.C.N.A. Convention.

# **Local and regional and National Newsletter Awards**

Every year the R.C.N.A. recognizes the efforts of member clubs, associations, and societies. This award is given for the best newsletter published by a local club and also for the best newsletter published by a regional or national association. To participate in the selection, clubs must submit samples of their newsletters to the R.C.N.A. Club Services Chairman.

# **Louise Graham Memorial Club of the Year Award**

The Louise Graham Memorial Club of the Year Award was established in 1986 to honour the memory of Louise who was the C.N.A. General Secretary from 1954 until her retirement in 1971. The award is offered annually to the R.C.N.A. member clubs that enter a competition to acknowledge the club having made the most significant overall achievement on behalf of its members and of the hobby. Clubs entering this completion provide reports of their activities during the previous calendar year. These are judged on the basic of topics at meeting, originality of activates, educational and numismatic promotions, coins shows and consistency of meeting. A panel of judges select the winner and its decision is announced at the following R.C.N.A. Convention Banquet.

## **Best of Show Award**

Every year the exhibits at the R.C.N.A. Convention are judged by a panel of volunteers assembled by Tim Henderson, who is the Chairman of the R.C.N.A. Awards and Medals Committee. This prestigious award is selected from all the first place finishers in the different exhibit categories at the annual Convention.

# **James E. Charlton Junior Award**

The James E. Charlton Junior Award was established in 1969 as an annual presentation for the best exhibit of Canadian coins displayed by junior (ages 16 and 17) member at the C.N.A. Convention. As a great believer in the importance of encouraging young people to take an interest in our hobby, Mr. Charlton created an award to acknowledge excellence in exhibits. The C.N.A. Executive named this award in his honour and to acknowledge his generous financial support towards this award. Each year's recipient receives an personal engraved plaque.

## Jean Bullen Award

The Jean Bullen Award was established in 2004 as an annual presentation for the best exhibit of Canadian coins displayed by a member of the C.N.A. Convention. At her passing, Jean Bullen made a financial bequest to provide an award for the category she had favoured the most – one in which her outstanding Canadian collection frequently took first place and often advanced to win "Best of Show." The C.N.A. Executive named the award in memory of Jean and to acknowledge her generous bequest. The prize is a silver medal engraved with the recipient's name.

# J. Douglas Ferguson Award

The J. Douglas Ferguson Award was established in 1969 and sponsored by Mr. Ferguson who at the time was the Honorary President of the C.N.A. This annual award is presented to the living numismatist who has made the greatest contribution during the past year to the advancement on numismatics in Canada by research, writing, publishing, or other means, and who has not previously won the award. Mr. Ferguson set up an independent Board of Award with C.N.A. representation for the award administration. He made the selections for the 1969 and 1970 winners and determined that the Board would choose the future winners from nominations made by C.N.A. members. Each year's winner for this separately sponsored award is announced during that year's R.C.N.A. Convention Banquet. The award is accompanied with a citation and a medal.
